C. WALDO SCOTT CENTER FOR H.O.P.E.

The Scott Center is a special place for youth and families in Newport News, VA. The mission of the Center is to provide HOPE to families, while developing the WHOLE CHILD. The Center provides, specifically to young people, education, training, and support needed to develop knowledge and skills necessary to take charge of their lives through positive action.

THE AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM

The Augusta Inettie Banks Edwards After School program is a collaborative effort with the Newport News Public School System. The After School program is named after Ms. Edwards, a Newport News resident and retired school teacher. Ms. Edwards continues to be active in civic, social, educational, and church related activities in the community.

The After School program is for youth enrolled in the Newport News Public School system, grades 1-8, priority is given to residents of the Southeast community. The program provides participants with educational enrichment classes and academic support. Youth will also have the opportunity to participate in instructional recreation, life skills groups, and cultural activities.

H.I.K.E. (Homework Is The Key to Excellence)

The H.I.K.E. component of the After School program is provided by the Newport News Public School System. Teachers and staff employed by the school system assist program participants with the completion of their school assignments and teach educational enrichment classes (science, math, language arts, and computer technology). H.I.K.E. teachers/staff will make arrangements to work with high school students, as requested.



PROGRAM SCHEDULE

The After School program will be facilitated from September 21, 2009– May 14, 2010. The program operates Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday from 3:30 p.m.— 5:30 p.m. and Wednesday from 1:00 p.m.— 5:30 p.m.

Educational services through HIKE are facilitated Monday through Thursday, 3:30 p.m.—5:30 p.m.

Fridays are fun leisure/recreation days for program participants.

Recreation, sports, & fitness activities will be provided by Doris Miller Community Center.

Visual and performing art activities will be provided by Downing-Gross Cultural Arts Center.

Social skills groups and activities are provided by the C. Waldo Scott Center.

BUS TRANSPORTATION

The Newport News Public School System provides the program with a school bus to assist in transporting youth home from the Scott Center. Transportation is provided within a limited community area.

PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT

Parental involvement in the After School program is essential in order for participants to fully benefit from the program. Your commitment and support can be shown by attending parent meetings, assisting with program outings, and on-site academic assistance with your youth.

PARENT INTAKE/ORIENTATION:

Scott Center Case Managers will contact parents for required paperwork and program orientation information.

Parents must attend all meetings!

PROGRAM REGISTRATION

Parents/guardians must submit a completed registration form, which indicates parental interest in having their youth enrolled in the After School program. If your youth is selected to enroll in the program, you will be notified by a Case Manager. All parents/guardians of selected participants will be required to meet with a Case Manager to complete necessary program forms. The number of slots per grade level are limited.



The Scott Center will accept completed registration forms beginning August 2009.

COMMUNITY TECHNOLOGY CENTER

The Scott Center has a community based computer lab, which can be used by community youth and adults. The Center also has a workforce development technology center, which can be used by community residents in search of employment through Internet job sites.
